

## **LATE-NIGHT VOTER REGISTRATION**

Tuesday, October 13, 2020 is the last day for residents to register to vote for the November 3, 2020 Presidential General Election in the State of New Jersey. In order to be eligible to vote, a person must be an American Citizen, be 18 years old on or before November 3, 2020, and be a resident of New Jersey and Bergen County.

Leonia residents may register to vote by one of the following ways:

- At the Office of the Borough Clerk located at Leonia Borough Hall, 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor, 312 Broad Avenue, Leonia, NJ 07605. Although Borough Hall is only open to the public until 7 p.m. on Tuesdays, the Office of the Borough Clerk will remain open until 9 p.m. on Tuesday, October 13<sup>th</sup>. If you arrive after 7 p.m., please call 201-592-5780 ext. 256 to notify us that you are dropping off your Voter Registration Application and someone will assist you.
- At the Office of the Superintendent of Elections, located at One Bergen County Plaza, Room 380, in Hackensack. This office will be open from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. on Tuesday, October 13, 2020.

## **CHANGE IN POLLING LOCATION FOR NOVEMBER 3<sup>RD</sup> GENERAL ELECTION**

**Please be advised that the sole polling place for the November 3<sup>rd</sup> General Election is the Recreation Center Gymnasium located at 370 Broad Avenue. All election districts will be located within this polling location. Polls will be open 6 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Tuesday, November 3<sup>rd</sup>.**

## **GENREAL ELECTION INFORMATION**

On August 14, 2020, Governor Murphy signed Executive Order No. 177 which requires the Office of the Bergen County Clerk to mail a Vote-By-Mail Ballot to all registered voters within Bergen County. We have received confirmation from the Bergen County Clerk's office on Friday, September 25<sup>th</sup> that Mail-In Ballots have been mailed to all active registered voters within Leonia; you should receive yours within a week. If you do not receive your ballot by October 5<sup>th</sup>, you should contact the Bergen County Clerk's office at 201-336-7020 to request a duplicate.

You are strongly encouraged to return your ballot as soon as possible. There are three ways to cast your Vote-By-Mail ballot:

### **OPTION 1:**

Complete and return your ballot your ballot by mail in the postage-paid envelope provided. Ballots postmarked by November 3<sup>rd</sup> may be received by the Board of Elections by November 10<sup>th</sup> at 8 p.m. and will still be counted. All ballot packages contain peel-and-seal, first class postage-paid envelopes.

### **OPTION 2:**

Drop your completed ballot at one of the 18 Secure Ballot Drop Boxes, located throughout Bergen County, by 8 p.m. on November 3<sup>rd</sup> (Please visit [bergencountyclerk.org](http://bergencountyclerk.org) for Drop Box Locations.)

### **OPTION 3:**

Bring your completed ballot to the polling location on November 3<sup>rd</sup> by 8 p.m. **Please be advised that you may only bring your own ballot to the polling location as you will be required to sign the Voter Registration Book when dropping off your ballot.**

If you have a disability and need an accessible ballot, please contact (201) 336-7020 or you may go to the polling place, which will provide access to an in-person accessible voting device on General Election Day. Should you choose not to vote on a Mail-In Ballot and show up to the polling location, **only Provisional Paper Ballots** will be available to cast your vote. **The ADA compliant Voting Machine is only for voters who have a disability.**
